On the tenth day of Christmas, a Canuck sent to me:

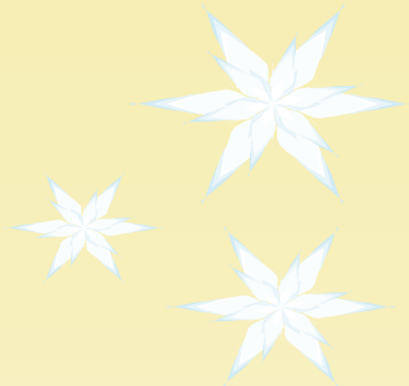
